### PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The Traveling Tree House is a mobile learning center that provides FREE summer learning opportunities for local children. At each visit kids experience 75 minutes of reading, crafts, and activities. A snack and gently used book, of their choice, is sent home with them to keep after each visit.

### PROGRAM DETAILS

- The Tree House stops at 10 designated locations within Douglas County
- Program lasts for 10 weeks and is designed for children Pre K - Elementary but open to all ages.

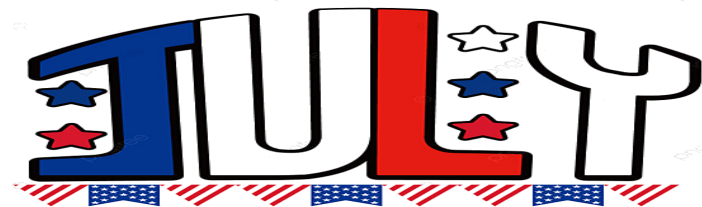

## SAVE THE DATES GARFIELD DAYS AUGUST 12<sup>TH</sup> & 13<sup>TH</sup>

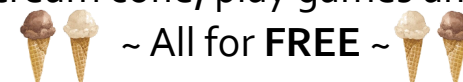
Got something fun, cool or unique?? Old tractor or car? Whatever you got! Bring it, we wanna see it!!!!

# FOR YOUR INFORMATION

- ◆ **Building Permits:** Pick-up your building permit application from City Hall and have the project approved at a Council meeting **BEFORE** you start construction of a new building, shed, fence or deck! Council meets once a month, plan ahead.  
\*\*Otherwise you could be charged with “After-the-Fact” charges (in addition to normal application fee) \$500 or 2x the application fee (whichever is greater)
- ◆ **Gopher State One Call:** Just a reminder to call 811 **BEFORE** you dig!! Stump removal is in this category as well. You can also call 1-800-252-1166. You don’t want to pay to repair something you hit while digging! It’s the law! **Reminder your contractors also, they know it’s the law.**
- ◆ **Sump Pumps:** You **MUST** drain your sump pumps outside, **NOT** down the sanitary sewer system.
- ◆ Water/sewer/stormwater payments are due by the 25<sup>th</sup> of each month to avoid a late fee
- ◆ All dogs are to be licensed yearly with the City of Garfield
- ◆ City Council meets the 2nd Monday of the month at 6pm
- ◆ **No** flushing of rags, wipes, paper towels, or any “non-flushable”.
- ◆ When selling a home, please read your water meter the day of the sale. Provide the reading along with your new address to the City Clerk for your final bill.
