ing, Council passed an increase to the
monthly water/sewer/stormwater rates. The
monthly base rate will increase to \$75.00.

The excess gallon rate will increase
from .003¢ to .006¢.

Snowplowing Policy



**Tickets will be issued to
offenders for the following.**

• Side walks are the re-
sponsibility of the owner
or renter of each property
to be clear of snow.



• Any sidewalks that are not
cleared within 24 hours of a snow-
fall, the property owners will be
assessed a fee of \$100 per a time
for snow removal service. **Proper-
ty owners are to keep their side-
walks clear of garbage cans and
any other obstructions.**

• November 1st to April
1st there is **no parking**
on the streets from 2
a.m. to 7 a.m. for snow
removal.



• Glenn's Towing will be con-
tacted for towing of vehicles
and all fees for the service will
be the owner's responsibility.
